



INFORMATION ABOUT KAPOK

Kapok is a fiber from the kapok tree - a tree which grows in the Rainforest. The kapok tree can be up to 100 meters high and up to 300 years old.

Kapok is small fibres which are picked from the seeds in the kapok fruits and the seeds can be picked year after year from the same tree, without having to fell the tree.

When the fibres are extracted from the seed husks the husks are used as fuel. With this work flow nothing will be wasted when the kapok fibres are extracted.

Kapok is the lightest fibre in the world - 8 times lighter than cotton fibres.

The kapok fibre is covered of a thin layer of wax which prevents insects from attacking the kapok tree and the kapok fruits. This is also the reason why no mites can live in the kapok and this makes the kapok very suitable for persons with allergy.

The kapok fibre has a special thermal property and has a silky soft surface, which is the reason that the kapok is also named "silk-cotton".
